I know from your announcements that you are as dismayed as thousands of islanders are by the way the Les Sablons project has been handled. article in the JEP on this produced the largest volume of responses **article** ever received **article** and all supporting the proposal and not one criticism of it with people expressing their astonishment and anger at how such an important scheme for regenerating this part of St. Helier, especially with the scheme having been given the approval of a knowledgeable and trusted planning inspector. The Constable of St. Helier, the Procureurs and he whole Roads Committee enthusiastically supported the decision.

Since article, a number of developers with plans for important proposals for other regeneration projects in St. Helier are thinking seriously about taking heir business elsewhere This is not what Jersey needs at this time.

The Minister's answer to the questions put to him by the Constable of St. Helier about whether or not any training was given about the Planning Law to States members when they are given the responsibility of making decisions on Planning revealed quite clearly that this did no happen but that the assistant minister who made the decision would have been "assisted" in arriving at the conclusions by a planning officer and this was not a matter for him but was the responsibility of the judicial greffe was simply extra-ordinary.

Anyone reading the one page reasons given by the assistant Minister for disagreeing with the Inspector would see the hand of planning officers in the very language used.

Non- planners like the assistant minister(which includes you and me) do not talk in terms of "the height does not relate well to the form, proportion, composition, scale and character of the surrounding buildings and would detract from the townscape character of the area" or that the scheme "fails to make a positive contribution to the local character and distinctiveness of the place as it does not successfully respond to its context to ensure the enhancement of identity, character and the creation of a durable and safe sense of space"

That is Planning speak pure and simple and the Assistant Mnister is going to have to explain in Court what it all means Questions like:

In what aspect does the scheme not fit in with the composition, scale and character of the surrounding areas?

In what way does it fail to make a positive contribution to the local character and distinctiveness or successfully respond to its context to ensure the enhancement of identity, character and the creation of a durable and safe sense of place.?

Bearing in mind that Commercial Street has, on one side of the street, the back-end of buildings on the Esplanade and one the other side the back and of buildings on Broad Street, makes it is one of the most nondescript and characteriess streets of S. Helier completely lacking in style or charm, matched only by Garden Lane for grimness. To suggest that this scheme fails to make a positive contribution of the "local character and distinctiveness" will give the lawyers for the developer a field day and subject the assistant minister to some highly embarrassing periods in court and make her a target for public ridicule and contempt

That would not be fair

It is clear from what you have publicly stated that you are unhappy about this decision Courts decide matters on fact and no one can doubt that this decision was unreasonable, especially as the developer is still holding a valid consent to build an even bigger project on the same area. You are able to stop things going any further now that the developer has decided o appeal the decision by getting your Ministers to agree that the States will not contest the appeal which will save everyone large sums of legal fees and allow the developer to get on with the job

I write this to you as the efforts you are making leading Jersey through what are difficult times I hope you will take this message in that spirit as I am deeply concerned about how the continuation of the Les Sablons situation will reflect on your government's efforts

Les Sablons development planning permission granted

A Ministerial Decision has today (29 December) been signed that gives planning permission for the Les Sablons development on Broad Street and Commercial Street for 238 apartments and a 103-room aparthotel.

This follows the refusal of the original planning application in December 2022 and the dismissal of an appeal more recently by Assistant Environment Minister, Deputy Hilary Jeune, who maintained the original decision to refuse planning permission.

Developers, Le Masurier, appealed to the Royal Court and Minister for Infrastructure, Deputy Tom Binet, was appointed as decision-maker entitled to make a decision under Article 108 of the Planning and Building (Jersey) Law 2002.

In granting planning permission, Deputy Binet considered the appeal papers, Island Plan policies, supplementary planning guidance and the Planning Inspector's reports.

Deputy Binet said: "I have accepted and agreed with the findings, recommendations and reasoning of the Planning Inspector and see no reason not to grant approval based on the evidence outlined to me."
