2024 UEFA

 – screening in
 the Howard
 Davis Park.

A1. The Council considered electronic mail correspondence from the Head of Ministerial Office, in connexion with a proposal to erect a large screen in the Howard Davis Park on which to show the 2024 Union of European Football Associations (UEFA) Championship during the period from 14th June to 14th July 2024.

Ministers were apprised of the indicative costings of the event, which included hire and staging, facilities, security and insurance. It was noted that the Howard Davis Park had been agreed as the best venue for the screening and that the event would be arranged in tandem with the Jersey Football Association.

Deputy M.R. Le Hegarat of St. Helier North, Minister for Justice and Home Affairs, sought clarification in respect of the level of security to be provided by the events organiser, whether consultation had taken place with the States of Jersey Police and Honorary Police, whether the Bailiff's Chamber was aware of the plans and the potential for the siting of the screen in the Howard Davis Park to result in a reduction

in trade for hospitality premises. The Head of Ministerial Office undertook to circulate the information requested to Ministers.

Having considered the foregoing, the Council signalled its support for the proposal and requested officers to take the necessary action.
