Job purpose

The main purpose of this post is to provide parent infant psychoanalytic psychotherapy to parents within Jersey.

This post is being developed to improve outcomes for children linked with 1001 day initiative.

The aims are not only to meet the immediate presenting problems in the baby or the toddler, but also to help the parent and child feel more positively about themselves and their interaction. Each intervention looks to promote the importance of early attachment and the importance of investment in very early relationships to improve life outcomes for children.

The potholder will be supported by the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service whilst working in partnership with early years practitioners across the island. There may also be opportunities for the post holder to be involved in teaching and development of Psychodynamic principles across services.

Job specific outcomes

- 1. To assist in developing a referral pathway within CAMHS framework, so that all new referrals are treated in a timely manner and followed up where necessary.
- 2. To complete assessments and care planning for new cases.
- 3. To plan and implement individually tailored psychotherapeutic treatment for parent-infant dyads. This to include time-limited and longer-term treatments.



- 4. To ensure that all ongoing cases are managed and recorded in accordance with the clinic's procedures.
- 5. To produce clinical reports as required.
- 6. To record contact and performance data as required to meet key performance indicators
- 7. To liaise with external parties regarding appropriate referrals, as agreed and in accordance with the clinic's policies regarding patient confidentiality.
- 8. To assist other staff members in providing specialist consultation from the perspective of a parent infant psychoanalytic psychotherapist to other professionals.
- 9. To represent the team at agreed external meetings, including reaching out to potential referrers and other third parties.
- 10 . To undertake all duties in accordance with the team policies, including those policies relating to the safeguarding of children.
