Job purpose

Directs the Meteorological Department, leading on the provision of meteorological and climatological services in support of the safety, security and general welfare of Channel Islands residents.

Job specific outcomes

Leading a team of meteorological specialists to provide meteorological and climatological services, including specialised services to meet the needs of specific industries such as Channel Island airfields and the Channel Islands Control Zone, emergency planners and emergency services to ensure public safety.

Formulate and lead on the deployment of policy, strategies, service planning, provision and continuous improvement of Meteorology and Climatology services to ensure that practices and procedures are aligned with best practice, the latest technological developments and regulations.

Organise climate recording and analysis to support infrastructure investment.

Maintain and develop commercial and digital meteorological services such as automatic weather systems that facilitate display of meteorological data for use across public and private sector organisations in the Channel Islands saving significant overlap of resources.

Be the Island meteorological and climatological expert, providing related advice to senior management, politicians and users of meteorological services across the Channel Islands supporting the safe delivery of commercial, transport and recreational activities for the welfare of the public.

Liaise with UK, French Government and European Meteorological Organisations ensuring that relevant information is exchanged for the provision of meteorological services.

Leading on the provision of a comprehensive shipping forecast to support safe sailing within the Channel Islands.

Develop and deliver minor capital and asset maintenance projects, including the Automatic Weather Station and Met Radar, co-ordinating consultants, contractors and suppliers to ensure that infrastructure essential for the provision of meteorological services to the Channel Island is effectively managed and maintained.



Leading on and undertaking research activities into the latest developments in meteorology, including reading scientific literature and initiating programmes to improve the forecasting process and develop products to support the weather dependent requirements of the wider organisation and external stakeholders (e.g. GoJ marine operations, Ports of Jersey, private sector navigation service providers, egivalent counterparts in other Channel Islands).

Provide expert witness advice to Arbitrators, Loss Adjusters, Advocates and Solicitors, concerning weather related incidents on land or at sea in the Channel Islands area to support citizens and assist the relevant authority to achieve case resolution.

Statutory responsibilities

Active engagement, participation and compliance with any other statutory responsibilities applicable to the role, as amended from time to time.

This role is politically restricted. The job holder is not permitted to undertake political activity involving standing for election to the Government or as a Parish Constable, or publicly supporting someone who is standing for election or playing a public part in any political manner.
