Job purpose

Responsible for strategic and operational management of the Jersey Emergency Flight Transfer Service (JETS) for Health and Community Services and Jersey wide care establishments to ensure compliance with corporate policy and service development for the safe transfer of patients to and from Jersey and the United Kingdom.

Responsible and accountable for interpreting corporate and national policies including specific information in order to ensure the long term strategic plans for the Island are met in relation to Flight Transfer Service, whilst providing direct clinical care for patients ranging from those requiring assistance on commercial flights to level 3 transfers including ICU, Neonatal / SCBU, Paediatric and Mental Health (Children and Adult) to improve patient outcomes.

Job specific outcomes

- Deliver an island wide emergency transfer service that caters for all age groups and conditions that require tertiary care not available on island. This may include both complex time critical missions and effective use of limited resources to repatriate patients back to Jersey post treatment.
- Lead on the continuous development of the In-Flight service for Jersey to ensure that services provided comply with the overall strategy of the Air ambulance contract and flight service provision.
- 3. Implement and develop effective multi-agency links, as the expert in aviation medicine for the Island to ensure the delivery of service is co-ordinated and in line with local and national benchmarks and standards.
- 4. Provide leadership and guidance for multidisciplinary teams for both the clinical management and decisions to transfer patients safely to enhance care delivery when transferring patients to and from UK tertiary centres. This includes time critical level 3 adult, paediatric and neonatal transfers, and additionally the assessment and transfer of highrisk psychiatric patients from mental health facilities and Jersey Prison.
- 5. Responsible for developing collaborative working with national and international aeromedical service providers / experts in the aviation and aeromedical industry, ensuring quality assurance and standards of services.
- 6. Responsible for defining and establishing the service specification required, meeting local, national and international standards to include training needs analysis, quality



improvement activities, audit, co-ordinating in-flight transfer education and training compliance to improve patient care and outcomes. These include but not limited to Civil Aviation Authority (CAA), European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA), Intensive Care Society (ICS) and Association of Anaesthetists of Great Britain & Ireland (AAGBI), recommendations and guidelines.

- Align the delivery of the service to meet organisational need through the application of effective clinical governance and risk management frameworks to reduce organisational risk.
- 8. Lead investigations and provide expert direction and recommendations on incidents to ensure compliance with local and national policy to reduce clinical risks and ensure learning from adverse events, including the responsibility of delivering multidisciplinary technical debriefs following internal datix incidents and from other key stakeholders involved in the transfer of patients, to inform learning, change practice where necessary and support staff.
- Responsible for providing clinical information in the specialist area to support hospital doctors, nurses, allied health professionals, senior managers, patients, and their families / carers regarding the Flight Service to ensure safe patient focused care.
- 10. Responsible for a budget (circa 2 million per annum Year 2021) including the tendering and procurement of Air Ambulance provider services jointly with Guernsey and being lead project manager with corporate procurement, Ports of Jersey teams, Guernsey business partners and UK tenderers, whilst ensuring compliance with Financial Direction to ensure efficiency and best value for money for the service and Government of Jersey.
- 11. Deliver education programmes in the specialist area to all levels of health staff across HCS and island wide partner agencies to ensure compliance with mandatory and national direction to maintain the safety of patients.
- 12. The post holder will be required to interact with media and marketing to promote the service and increase public awareness of JETS.
