Job purpose

• Provide clinical assessment and treatment to service users with complex mental health needs, and challenging behaviour, including those with personality disorders

- Provide assessment and treatment across teams within the Inpatient services and Community Mental Health Teams
- Work closely with team members in supporting service users and their carers

Job specific outcomes

- Works with other AHP's across Mental Health, sometimes leading specific delegated projects
- Works closely with team manager and the Lead AHP for Mental Health
- Works closely with Inpatient services
- Post holder is expected to build relationships with arts therapists in other organisations and within their professional body
- Identify and manage risks that may impact on service delivery, ensuring appropriate floor to board reporting mechanisms are followed. This will include clinical and non-clinical risks that ensure business continuity plans are implemented when required
- Provide expert clinical and care advice to services, ensuring standards of care and service development are maintained.
- Lead in the development of clinical practice across multi professional teams to ensure evidence based practice is implemented, up to date and appropriate for service provision.
- Maintain clinical credibility to enable role modelling is maintained and to continuously develop scope of clinical and non-clinical practice to ensure supervision of clinical services are maintained and evolved




- Provide assessment and treatment to service users with complex mental health issues and challenging behaviour including those with psychoses and those with personality disorders

- Lead on service innovation as delegated by the Lead AHP
