Job purpose

The job purpose is to contribute to the strategic aim of reducing substance misuse related harm in Jersey and to be professionally accountable for delivery of the specialist opiate pathway service.

The post holder will act as a lead to provide expert advice, guidance, clinical intervention and education to all levels of the multi-disciplinary team and partner agencies demonstrating a high degree of expertise, decision making and autonomy.

Job specific outcomes

Lead the provision of specialised programmes of care to clients with a range of complex physical, psychological and social needs who present to hospital and community settings with drug related problems ensuring the client group receive care, which is equitable and demonstrates best practice.

Provide clinical advice and be a lead specialist to support other professionals, clinicians, clients and their families to ensure care is client centred, safe and mitigates risk.

Authority to make clinical decisions, prioritise and triage referrals and direct client care in the speciality area within the community and hospital settings to ensure continuity of care.

Organise, in collaboration with the multi-disciplinary team the co-ordination and delivery of care packages to clients with complex needs and specific individual risks to ensure a seamless client journey across services.

Responsible for the formulation and implementation of local policy, guidance and advice documents relevant to the specialist area to ensure practice remains contemporary and in line with national guidelines.

Responsible for developing and delivering education and training programmes in the specialist area to all levels of health professionals across the departments and partner agencies in order to cascade best practice, raise standards and promote a culture of collaborative working.

Responsible for meeting the Alcohol and Drug Service objectives in order to contribute to the strategic and business objectives of the service and the wider public health agenda.

Develop and maintain effective communication networks to actively promote use of the service. Participate in meetings and other forums to represent clients or the service by providing expertise in the specialist area.



Work at the forefront of practice innovation to enhance nursing practice and challenge professional and organisational boundaries in the interest of clients to ensure excellence in care is delivered across the organisation for the benefits of the client group.
