Job purpose

To contribute to the Speech and Language Therapy Department in developing and implementing a specialist Speech and Language Therapy Service for a paediatric client group.

This service is to include the provision of specialist evaluation, advice and training of clients, families and other professional staff on the management of complex communication and language disorders to maximise function and participation and minimise the impact of disability on wellbeing and ability to participate in daily life.

To provide a professional resource for other disciplines so that the contribution of Speech and Language Therapy can be integrated within the total service provision.

As a specialist and autonomous practitioner, the post holder will demonstrate a high level of clinical reasoning, diagnostic and therapy skills within the community and hospital setting. They will report on clinical findings and advise on recommended management providing second opinion where required.

As a specialist practitioner this will include additional training and expertise for extended scope of practice and differential diagnostics E.g. Autistic Spectrum Disorder, dysfluency, hearing impairment, Developmental Language Disorder, voice, dysphagia, speech disorders.

Job specific outcomes

- Contribute to the Speech and Language Therapy Department in developing and implementing a specialist area of speech and language therapy. To identify needs, research, interpretation and to implement developments in speech and language therapy practice.
- 2. Contribute to broader organisational objectives and changes in order to support a continuously improving high quality service to clients.
- 3. Receive and manage direct referrals from a range of professionals from in-patient and community settings.
- 4. Assess and diagnose clients to identify how they may benefit from speech and language therapy with ongoing dynamic assessment and management of the client and family's needs. To provide support and collaborate with other professional disciplines, service providers and agencies to ensure each client receives the specific care required.



- 5. Manage the ongoing, appropriate treatment, advice and strategies to support the specific language, communication and feeding needs of a client, their family, education setting and wider professional disciplines.
- 6. Contribute to the departmental business plan, guidelines and policies for the specialist area of responsibility to ensure that client cases are effectively managed within best practice guidelines, time and resourcing constraints.
- 7. Maintain appropriate client records of assessment, intervention, progress and relevant statistics and administrative records regarding all areas of work.
- 8. To monitor the effectiveness of intervention, to facilitate intervention planning and long term client management and to support the ongoing evaluation of the efficiency and effectiveness of the service to inform departmental service planning.
- 9. Develop and deliver specialist training programmes, providing information and advice to professional qualified and unqualified staff, voluntary organisations and family carers in order to improve the understanding of clients need and promote effective management and development of communication, language and feeding needs.
- 10. Act as mentor and provide regular supervision, advice, support and where necessary training for professional peers, speech and language keyworkers and assistants, speech and language therapy students on work experience and staff from other services allocated to assist with client intervention. To support their personal development aims and help them to fulfil the requirement of their roles.
