Job purpose

Supporting the Chief Veterinary Officer in carrying out their role to promote best animal health and welfare practice for all farmed, captive and domestic species and controlling endemic and exotic diseases in animals to safeguard animal and public health.

Facilitating the international trade in animals and animal products and overseeing the veterinary border control point to ensure that live animals and animal products entering Jersey are safe and meet the specific import conditions laid out in legislation. The post holder will deputise for the Chief Veterinary Officer as necessary, leading some programmes and supporting on others to provide senior veterinary leadership and advice.

Job specific outcomes

On behalf of the Chief Veterinary Officer, provide expert veterinary advice to the Government of Jersey, addressing a wide range of issues, including terrestrial and aquatic animal disease control, border control and animal import related risk management and veterinary public health to protect Islanders' wellbeing, the environment and Jersey's economic interests against the effects of animal disease and breaches of the law and international treaties that Jersey is signatory to.

Exercise controls on animal and animal products import and export in accordance with Jersey and UK legislation, protecting human health.

Enforce animal health and welfare legislation by issuing entry documentation for imported live animals (and animal products if appropriate), ensuring that specific controls are implemented at their point of entry to mitigate against the risk of serious human and animal disease transmission; provide expert witness opinions to the Court where necessary to promote human and animal health and welfare across the Island.

Represent Jersey locally and internationally on matters of animal health and welfare and veterinary public health, meeting regularly on behalf of the Chief Veterinary Officer with their counterparts from the UK countries to keep up-to-date with the latest developments and best practice procedures.

Assist the Chief Veterinary Officer in providing policy advice on Brexit and SCoPAFF (Standing Committee on Plants, Animals, Food and Feed) matters to court lawyers and draftsmen to support legal processes and drafting/reviewing of legislation so as to address the regulatory



challenges arising from changes in the political and economic regimen of the Island based on its links to the UK.

Enforce animal welfare legislation by ensuring the issuing licences for breeding, selling, keeping and training or boarding animals as appropriate, including investigating reports of adverse welfare, providing education as required and expert witness opinions to the Court where necessary to promote animal health and welfare across the Island.

Provide cover for statutory Official Veterinarian duties at the Government of Jersey Abattoir to ensure animal welfare, enhance food security and protect public health; provide statutory disease surveillance both actively and passively, including capability for routine TB testing to protect and enhance animal and public health.

Support the Chief Veterinary Officer in:

- the design, implementation and accreditation of disease control and eradication programmes;
- the review and updating of exotic disease outbreak contingency planning;
- negotiations on export health certification for animals and animal products from Jersey to UK, EU and Third Countries to facilitate safe international trade and support a thriving rural economy and local food industry;
- providing veterinary input in matters related to market access and future trade implications.

Carry out and supervise livestock inspections as appropriate, collecting blood and tissue samples and, if necessary, conducting gross post-mortem examinations to treat and investigate animal disease.

On behalf of the Chief Veterinary Officer, run internal departmental research as part of local species conservation initiatives and submit data and demonstrate Jersey animal disease techniques in research projects with UK universities to inform developments in local animal health and welfare policy.

Statutory responsibilities

Active engagement, participation and compliance with any other statutory responsibilities applicable to the role, as amended from time to time.


