Job purpose

This is a statutory role, as prescribed under the Motor Traffic Law, which is responsible for promoting compliance and enforcing the statutory liabilities of road users to regulate the condition and operation of motor vehicles ensuring the highest possible standards of vehicle and user safety on the roads. Working closely with the Police, inspecting vehicles and creating comprehensive reports which may be used in Court as evidence or in conjunction with appearing as an expert witness.

Job specific outcomes

Take an oath before the Royal Court to carry out the duties of a Traffic Officer as prescribed under the Motor Traffic Law. Committing to appropriately report to the relevant Police Authorities any criminal or other offence that has been committed in violation of the Motor Traffic Law.

Carryout Forensic Post Collision Investigations on vehicles after serious or fatal Road Traffic Collisions (RTCs) both in Jersey and other jurisdictions.

Examine alleged defective vehicles, both in the testing station or at roadside checks with the view of prosecution to ensure the highest possible standards of vehicle and user safety on the roads. Conducting the necessary risk assessments of potential roadside checks, sites of work outside of the test station and when inspecting unusual or abnormal vehicles.

Create complex inspection / examination reports, for review and approval by the Vehicle Standards Manager (Senior Traffic Officer), for the purpose of Police prosecution or enforcement. Ensure all reports are of a high standard and able to withhold scrutiny, where they may be used by States of Jersey Police, Honorary Police, the Viscounts department, Customs, Health and Safety or as evidence in Court / Parish Hall Enquiry.

Investigate allegations relating to the construction and use or the operation of motor vehicles making recommendations to the Vehicle Standards Manager (Senior Traffic Officer) on the appropriate action to be taken including where it is necessary to remove vehicles from the road where they are unroadworthy or defective.

Respond to technical queries from States and Honorary Police regarding motor vehicles and vehicle registration legislation. Deal with enquiries and complaints from members of the public, referring any contentious issues to the Vehicle Standards Manager (Senior Traffic Officer).



Inspect Public Service Vehicles (PSVs) to determine their entitlement, roadworthiness and suitability to be issued a PSV licence to ensure the safety of passengers using public transport and other road users. Carrying out annual roadworthiness examinations on all vehicles issued with a licence.

Assess the suitability and roadworthiness of vehicles requesting vehicle exemption licence permits (P30s) for oversized, overweight or abnormal loads. Issue licences and impose suitable conditions on such licences to ensure the safety of, and minimise the impact on other road users. Carryout annual roadworthiness examinations on all vehicles issued with a licence.

Check the integrity of documentation and vehicles form other jurisdictions for potentially stolen or non-compliance, prior to local registration. Undertake individual vehicle type approval (IVA) inspections for non-compliant vehicles.

Support the Vehicle Standards Manager by providing an alternative point of contact for enforcement agencies, professional bodies and the general public on motor vehicle and road traffic technical matters.

Conduct Periodic Technical Inspections (PTIs) in addition to the Vehicle Examiners on minibuses (annually) as well as light motorcycles and mopeds (at 3 years, then 2 years after).

Value vehicles for legal or duty purposes at the request of Government fiscal departments.

Undertake specific survey and research projects as determined by the Senior Traffic Officer.

Promote road safety through education, working with schools, probation and via established youth and States of Jersey Police schemes.

Maintain expert understanding of the relevant technical information, legislation and best practice ensuring these are incorporated into their own work and that of the section.

Ensure the appropriate maintenance of equipment required to carry out operations as well as the reporting of any accidents on the appropriate systems.

Contribute ideas to continually improve services, to optimise efficiency, performance and customer experience.


