

### Marine Science and Research Officer

### Job purpose

Undertaking scientifically robust marine research work and development projects focused on marine environmental issues and also sustainability and environmental conservation in response to concerns and aims of the commercial, leisure fishing and aquaculture industries to ensure that local and international environmental commitments are met.

Deputising for the senior officers in the identification of best practice policies to manage sustainably and effectively regulate the use of the Island's marine resources.

#### Job specific outcomes

Research policies and international best practice to inform the design, planning and management of an annual programme of fisheries stock management, development and monitoring; utilise rigorous scientific methods to gather and analyse data and produce technical reports that identify trends on issues related to the marine environment and commercial and leisure fishing accessible to a varied audience, including senior management, Ministers, local and international scientific and policy working groups.

Undertake research and monitoring related to marine environmental issues and policies, such as but not exclusive to invasive marine species, heavy metal monitoring, marine environment mapping and monitoring of marine wildlife.

Project manage and supervise marine research undertaken by other officers, researchers, and consultants, ensuring work is completed in accordance with appropriate methodologies, on time and within budget.

Act as the lead officer in reviewing and managing the licencing of marine scientific work and exemptions in Jersey territorial waters; make judgements and issue recommendations to the Minister / Service Director as to the potential risks and impact of research work undertaken by local and international research groups and monitor compliance.

Represent Jersey at local, national and international marine / fisheries meetings, presenting papers and providing interpretation of scientific data and technical advice on issues of fisheries science and stock management, so as to inform decision making; assist the senior officer in initiating and maintaining relationships with Government bodies, NGOs and academic institutions at UK and international level.



Act as the lead officer in reviewing and managing the licencing of fish farms / aquaculture developments and provide professional advice to applicants and other stakeholders, including Ministers, the Government Planning Team and the Fisheries and Marine Resources Advisory Panel, ensuring environmental and legal considerations are taken into account in planning decisions and policies.

Maintain effective communication and liaison with all members of the fishing industry, stakeholders and the public; organise the dissemination of scientific research results related to emerging fishing technologies and new management techniques that support the sustainability of fishing stock and protect the marine environment.

As a Marine Resources Officer and designated British Sea Fisheries Officer, act as Skipper or Patrol Commander of the marine vessel and undertake effective surveillance, monitoring and inspection of local and foreign fishing vessels at sea, shore based activities and local and foreign marine activities, taking appropriate enforcement action and ensuring that seized equipment and vessels are handled in accordance with the law to ensure compliance with marine environmental legislation; participate in joint patrols with French and UK authorities for cross-jurisdictional enforcement work.

Provide additional support for marine activities, including piloting or manning departmental vessels for research work or undertake search and rescue work.


Gather evidence and prepare case files relating to legal infractions for use in court and give evidence of offences as part of prosecution work, working synergistically with the Marine Operations and Compliance Team in the provision of a comprehensive marine resources related enforcement service.

Manage the optimal allocation of team resources to ensure work is completed timely and efficiently.
