

### **Access Support Officer**

#### Job purpose

Providing support to the Access Officer in order to deliver the Countryside Access Strategy for Jersey through programmes, management of and improvements to facilities, and through third-party partnerships to enable sustainable public access and recreation and raise awareness of the Island's biodiversity and landscape.

#### Job specific outcomes

Support the Environment Officer in the delivery of vision and objectives related to the Countryside Access Strategy for Jersey through research and development of additional routes and links to the existing access network.

Manage, develop and provide guidance to service providers, users and contractors to ensure minimal impact on landscape and wildlife conservation in environmentally sensitive areas.

Coordinate ongoing maintenance and improvement of the existing network of paths, and associated infrastructure, in order to promote and encourage safe public access (currently 70km total length).

Liaise with landowners to negotiate access to privately owned land. Monitor the impact of different user groups on each other and the environment.

Provide specialist advice to, and help in the appointment, management and co-ordination of contractors and rangers carrying out specified works to the footpaths, including improvements, checking compliance to ensure objectives are met; effectively communicate complex guidance and monitor all projects and works to ensure they are performed to the required specification, quality, cost and timescales, and that they comply with all legal and Departmental standards.

Work closely with and supervise community groups, volunteers and local organisations working on the access network.

Produce educational and interpretative material (such as signage, leaflets, printed and digital media) whilst ensuring consistent working with other stakeholders and partners by developing good working relationships.

Maintain website information, including the interactive map and social media to inform the public, keeping them current and fit for purpose.



Contribute to the development of links with user groups to promote awareness of ecological impacts of recreation, encourage good practice and mitigate against conflict.

Work closely with the other members of the Natural Environment Team to review current practice in order to implement improvements and develop new projects and research that enhances the provision of a high-quality access network.

Liaise with Regulation and provide advice relating to use of the access network in any potential enforcement investigations; prepare expert witness statements for investigations and act as an expert witness in court prosecutions.


Monitor compliance in relation to H&S issues for contractors, and for the land and access infrastructure that falls within the section's remit, liaising with the departmental H&S team and taking appropriate action when required.

Work with the Natural Environment Officer – Warden to carry out infrastructure audits and develop appropriate mobile software applications to improve network users' experience.
