

### **Marine and Fisheries Assistant**

#### Job purpose

Administer Jersey's complex marine management and fishing schemes and in the collation of scientific data and monitoring of the marine and coastal environment in support of research activity for the sustainable management of the Island's marine resources and conservation of the coastal natural environment; autonomously running marine science and compliance projects, including species management work and developments and changes to licensing / permitting rules aimed at safeguarding fishing stock, the marine environment and the future of the fishing industry.

Enforcing fisheries legislation through the inspection of landings of the local fleet as well as local, UK and foreign vessels. skippering patrol vessels within Jersey fisheries limits.

#### Job specific outcomes

Assist designated officers under Sea Fisheries legislation and other environmental and conservation legislation undertake surveillance, monitoring and inspection of local and foreign fishing, leisure, boating, dumping and aquaculture activities, both onshore and within Jersey's territorial limits.

Collate catch and landings data and assist with the completion of the Section's reporting obligations.

Support other members of the Marine Resources section with tasks related to the administration of local aquaculture operators licensing and product movements (i.e. import and export). Administering licensing and permitting schemes that need to comply with international agreements, processing applications, gathering evidence and producing reports and recommendations on applications for special licenses.

Contribute to the section's research projects in conducting routine monitoring and participation in scientific activities at sea and collating industry data. Independently running projects related to scientific and compliance work, including assessments of exploited stocks, habitats and species, EIAs, aquaculture species and general marine resource related R&D projects.

Undertake specialist procurement of assets, ordering materials and equipment for the section's operations and raising purchase orders and receipts on delivery to support the effective and efficient running of the Marine Resources section.



Assist in the maintenance and equipping of vessels and other Marine Resources assets, including routine maintenance of vessels and the servicing and maintenance of operational and research equipment.

Provide additional support for marine activities, including piloting or manning departmental vessels for research work or undertake search and rescue work.

Act as Assistant Boarding Officer of the marine vessel and undertake effective surveillance, monitoring and inspection of local and foreign fishing vessels at sea, shore based activities and local and foreign marine activities.

Take appropriate enforcement action and ensure that seized equipment and vessels are handled in accordance with the law. Participate in joint patrols with French and UK authorities for cross-jurisdictional enforcement.


Undertake enforcement activities related Marine and Fisheries management to protect fish stocks and prevent over-fishing to ensure compliance with marine environmental legislation.

Where deemed appropriate under the sections enforcement policy, support more formal action by gathering evidence, interviewing suspects under caution, taking witness statements and preparing case files for prosecution. Working with colleagues in Regulation to ensure consistency.
