

### **Deputy Emergency Planning Officer**

#### Job Purpose

The Deputy Emergency Planning Officer deputises for the Emergency Planning Officer in relation to the delivery of both government emergency planning (including advice and support to the Emergencies Council) and the support function to the Jersey Resilience Forum.

Within the role, the Deputy Emergency Planning Officer acts as the Jersey Resilience Forum Support Manager, leading a team who, as well as delivering key activities on behalf of the Emergency Planning Officer more broadly, focus on supporting the work of the wider responder community through the Forum.

#### **Job Specific Outcomes**

- Deputise for the Emergency Planning Officer, covering central government strategy, policy, doctrinal and legislative development in order to create and maintain Jersey's resilience and readiness against global, regional and local risks and threats.
- 2. Ensure the development and maintenance of a strategic risk and threats register to support government policy and decision making as well as to inform contingency planning activity across a wide range of resilience partners.
- 3. Provide expert advice to ministers in the form of briefings, reports and discussion papers in relation to emergency planning.
- 4. Provide expert advice and support to ministers and resilience partners during the response to crises, emergencies or major incidents, helping them to make well-informed and timely decisions to mitigate the effects of any event.
- 5. Responsible for the management of delegated strategic relationships with officials in key UK Government departments (Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Justice), relevant UK and other resilience forums as well as with French counterparts so that critical resilience and civil contingencies information and intelligence is available to the right people, within the bounds of information security policy, in order for high quality safety and security decisions to be made.
- 6. Through formal and peer based leadership, promote a culture where all partners and stakeholders recognise their role in resilience and emergency planning and actively contribute to a shared agenda; this will include engagement with the wider community.



- 7. Responsible for the work of a team of Assistant Emergency Planning Officers for providing professional support to the Jersey Resilience Forum, its various groups, their chairs and officers from partner organisations contributing to the work of the forum as well as providing professional advice to forum partners as required.
- 8. Support the Emergency Planning Officer in the delivery of an assurance framework across civil contingencies activity undertaken by government and resilience forum partners, based upon leading practice, with appropriate reporting mechanisms to enable practice development.
- 9. Line Management of a small, specialist team of emergency planners and the associated budgets of the team.


