

## Substance Misuse Officer

# Job purpose

The post holder provides an efficient and effective information, supervision and risk management service in relation to clients whose use of substances is linked to offending.

The post holder, who works between the Probation Service and Alcohol and Drug Service, will provide high intensity interventions to address dangerous substance use, polysubstance misuse, substance dependence and addiction. The post holder will be required to use interventions such as Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), Motivational interviewing and Person-Centred Counselling to clients who have a variety of psychological difficulties of moderate to severe complexity including co-morbid and trauma presentations.

The post holder will provide evidence-based treatment primarily for substance misuse and also for a wide range of psychological conditions to improve mental health and well-being in Jersey for children and adults. The post holder will be required to manage the risk, and at times be the primary case co-ordinator, to ensure that the child or adult is supported by relevant services to meet their needs.

#### Job specific outcomes

- 1. Provide the Island's Courts, Prison and Parish Hall Enquiries with detailed and accurate reports and assessments about offenders in order to assist and inform the sentencing process and release from custody assessments and treatment options. This involves the use of accredited assessment tools.
- 2. Contribute to the generic functions of the probation service team to include, working as a duty Officer, attending Magistrates and Youth Court, offering support and advice to concerned professionals, responding to service users and parents, gathering and sharing information with partner agencies, undertaking home visits where necessary.
- 3 Supervise offenders, both within community and custodial settings, for whom use of substances has contributed to offending behaviour, to promote the concepts of rehabilitation, harm reduction, safeguarding and public protection. This involves assessment, formulating a case plan with the client, implementing interventions, reviewing and evaluating the impact of work undertaken.
- 4 Provide individual and group interventions within the Prison and community settings with a focus on building emotional coping skills, reducing harm, and strategies for relapse



prevention. This is to allow clients to explore their relationship with substances, reflect on the implications of their use and support them in adopting harm reduction strategies

- 5 Exercise the required degree of monitoring and enforcement in relation to compliance with court orders, including responses to treatment designed to address substance misuse challenges.
- 6 Represent the Probation and Alcohol and Drug Services in a range of multi-agency meetings designed to promote social inclusion, the safeguarding of vulnerable people and the effective supervision of offenders who pose a risk to others. These for include the Jersey Multi Agency Public Protection Arrangements (JMAPPA) and child safeguarding meetings.
- 7 To work as part of a multi-disciplinary community Alcohol & Drug service which provides clinic based outpatient services, outreach and liaison to support integrated practice and seamless service delivery for clients. To work as an autonomous professional within relevant professional guidelines (e.g., BACP), policies and procedures of the service.
- 8 Develop and implement a high-quality service of psychological therapies, including Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT) that offer high intensity, evidence-based therapies appropriate to the psychological difficulty presented, including interventions for alcohol/substance use disorders, in order to improve mental health and wellbeing, increase the opportunities for community inclusion and reduce risk of reoffending.
- 9 Keep coherent records of all activity and accurate collation of data, including the results of clinical audits of service performance and service user surveys and evaluations, to ensure all requirements relating to data collection are carried out in line with service protocols.
- 10 Educate professionals, stakeholders and other services about evidence-based therapies for substance misuse and the remit of the service.

#### Statutory responsibilities

This role is politically restricted. The job holder is not permitted to undertake political activity involving standing for election to the Government or as a Parish Constable, or publicly supporting someone who is standing for election or playing a public part in any political manner.
