Government highlights four years of work

When the Council of Ministers published their [Common Strategic Policy](#)* (CSP) four years ago, they outlined five key objectives for their time in Government. Since then, officers have been working to deliver many hundreds of projects, initiatives, and services to meet those objectives.

A six-week campaign is being launched today (Monday 31 January) to highlight the achievements of public sector staff, who have continued to focus on these priorities and have delivered many new initiatives during a very challenging time which has been overshadowed by the pandemic and to thank them for their hard work.

The first week will focus on 'Putting Children First'. Following the publication of the Jersey Care Enquiry report in 2017, one of the main recommendations was the publication of the Children and Young People's Plan in March 2019. This sets out the steps Government is taking to make Jersey the best place to grow up, and to improve the lives of families and young people.

This week the campaign will focus on the objectives contained in the Children's Plan, and other initiatives that support children and young people.

The campaign will feature videos, interviews and blogs on all Government's social media platforms.

The campaign is also intended to remind Islanders about the Government services available to them, and to encourage them to engage with Government either by voting in the elections, standing for office, or exploring career options in one of the Government departments.

Officers and Ministers will be available for interview throughout the campaign to talk about the projects which have helped to meet the objectives of the Common Strategic Priorities.
