From our meeting my concerns are further emphasised as the following was noted: -Downpour: There is no clear place for the water to run off during a deluge of rain other than toward 1. . See Photo 121838 attached Poor Design. The small pipe, apparently for all sloping roof drainage, offers minimal protection for . See Photo 121838 attached There is no cover on the pipe entry to prevent detritus blocking this drain point. It is already getting blocked by leaves falling from the Sycamore tree. See Photo 1217098 attached 4. The previous flat roof has been replaced with a pitched roof which is angled so that water will run off and boundary wall. Photo to followpool against the 5. Ruberoid appears to have been removed from the wall. Photo to follow-6. There appears to be no membrane or protection on the chimney stack to stop water penetration. See Photo 121836 7. The developer has extended on the southern side and the extensions to number 8 and 9 Brooklyn Mews join against the North Wall belonging to me without any contractual rights to do so. They have replaced a temporary, flat, corrugated plastic structure with a permanent roof which now has a sharp pitch to run water directly into due damp problems There are caused by this new structure. There was no adequate consultation and I am of the view that this roof should be completely removed and replaced with a flat roof, coupled with adequate protection against inevitable downpours, to protect both and 8 & 9 Brooklyn Mews.
