Julian – following your note of 26 March - can you provide an update on PPE provision for JHA. And in the light of the SCG yesterday, where we were all made aware that 20,000 face masks have now arrived. I assume more to follow this week onwards, now the UK supply is being sorted?

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Appropriate and timely deployment of PPE will play a major in ensuring we can sustain our ability to deliver, protect the public and ultimately save lives. Failure to deploy in a timely way, when PPE is now available to our teams, may expose them to an avoidable risk, harm and possibly the avoidable death of one of our officers/staff or those in our care.

We all appreciate that to date due to a shortage of PPE, priority has been to ensure HCS colleagues had sufficient and were being prioritised so they could deal with positive cases and those requiring hospitalisation. However, with the 20,000 more masks and other PPE now available, we should now be able to ensure that all front line services are provided with appropriate PPE. JHA services after HCS will have most exposure to C19 infection.

Hi Nick – I think it will work. The Bronze Cell is led by [redacted] who is directly linked with the Infection Prevention and Control team who decide who must wear what, for what. They also have full control over all PPE stock coming in to the Island and have firmly centralised it. On that level, while bronze, they are the experts. What we can then do is collate the information via the MAIC and push back from Silver into the bronze cell to tell them our requirements across the whole picture. Where there is contention or a need to prioritise, we can do that at TCG. Will get a status and requirements message out today.

We are working hard as part of the Island wide response to C19, to PREVENT AND PROTECT C19 from entering the prison, and protecting our most vulnerable older prisoners or prisoners with ULHCs, and ensuring our staff well-being. So far we have been successful, and the extra PPE is very valuable to assist us remaining in the Prevent Phase of our response for as long as we can.
