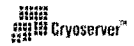

Dear Health colleagues

Just a short note to say thank you all for your assistance with support to ensure we have resilience in our small but dedicated SoJPS healthcare team, and also for the face masks ppe for our staff that we received last night.

We are working hard as part of the Island wide response to C19, to PREVENT AND PROTECT C19 from entering the prison, and protecting our most vulnerable older prisoners or prisoners with ULHCs, and ensuring our staff well-being. So far we have been successful, and the extra PPE is very valuable to assist us remaining in the Prevent Phase of our response for as long as we can.

We are poised should we need to move into DELAY AND PROTECT, with our aim to contain and manage C19 infection, ensuring we minimise our impact as much as we can on the Hospital and especially the limited ICU capacity. I know you will support us as much as you can should we detect C19 in the prison and move into DELAY/PROTECT.

As mentioned at the end of today's CAM meeting, we are currently working on updated MOH guidance for [redacted] on use of face masks - more positively encouraging people to consider wearing face masks when outside the home. We will link this to information on how to make masks at home, and will designate retailers of fabric and sewing supplies as essential so that people can do it.

[redacted] is drafting, and working on how to ensure fit with PPE guidelines.

However we also wanted to give you a heads up because issuing this guidance will probably increase desire for centrally provided masks across essential workers (i.e., to use when guidance suggests no need for PPE, but when outside the home). Wanted to flag- and happy of course to discuss.



Unfortunately, I can not make the SCG mtg tomorrow due to another mtg [REDACTED] will represent SoJPS and is fully versed with SoJPS Covid-19 contingency plans.

Noting point 35 in the attached TCG document I am surprised to see that a decision has been made to issue PPE to other JHA services and does not mention the prison service. If police or customs detain someone and they have a risk of Covid 19- the detained person could well be admitted to the prison. we must have an infection risk at this point that is no different from staff in the Police or Customs who may be wearing PPE to manage the offender/detainee?

Also from an infection control / spread perspective the prison is also an extremely high risk area of rapid cross infection with [REDACTED] plus prisoners and [REDACTED] staff living and working in very close proximity. Should Covid-19 arrive on Jersey, the prison will contain prisoners who may be positive and ill, and contagious, until they are acute and need to be transferred to the hospital. These staff - both nursing and officers staffing the unit containing Covid -19 ill prisoners, would need comparable PPE to nursing staff in HCS?

Could I have some assurance that the risk SoJPS staff may be exposed too is treated and understood in the same light as other JHA services and HCS. The issue of PPE should surely be based on risk of exposure? I raised this point at the last SCG - SoJPS officers will have a similar risk exposure to colleagues in SoJP and JCIS, and our HC team to HCS nurses.

I appreciate fully the need to control issue of PPE. My point is from the TCG action log I have now had sight of, and specifically point 35, SoJPS appears to have been omitted from consideration of appropriate PPE?

Hi Nick,

thanks for the email raising your concerns. Primarily the advice you need would come from Health. The advice for first responders is attached. There may be a bigger piece to pull together bespoke to the Prison service. Can you confirm if the UK Prison service has any specific SOP in relation to this? If not, it may be that a specific piece of work is required. I had previously raised the issue of PPE and asked for consideration of a Health and Safety impact group to be established, however there was little appetite for this.

SOJPS should in my view have access to the the same PPE. This has been sourced from HCS stores at 5 Oaks. HCS may have a view, and interested to understand their view and confirm this is the case.

Maybe [REDACTED] can raise this issue at the SCG this afternoon for specific direction.

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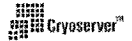

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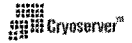

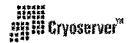
