I refer to your recent allegations regarding of the eastern part of Field 1007 to domestic cur	affecting a material change of use rtilage.
I inspected the site on 5 th October 2012 with my colleague, and noted that the part of the site in question was laid to grass, relatively close-mown and with a line of shrubs planted alongside the hedge which forms the western boundary of the field. In terms of planning legislation, neither the mowing of grass nor the planting of a few shrubs constitutes 'development'. In a similar vein, nothing at all was apparent on my inspection to indicate that a 'material change of use' of the land had occurred. The field could revert to grazing land or crop production without any further works or clearance.	
Although in a tidy and slightly manicured state, to domestic useage. It could be said to have a 'nilplanning perspective at least, to walk on and plants on the land.	use'. has every right, from a
I short, I am satisfied that there has not been any breach of planning control in respect of the alleged change of use of the field to domestic curtilage. The situation on the ground today is little different to the situation over a decade ago when the Department made similar observations.	
The case is, hereby, dropped and the Enforcement Team will take no further action nor entertain further discussion on the matter of the alleged change of use of land on the eastern portion of Field 1007 unless there is a clear and material change in the facts.
