Hi

Yes, I started to have a think about this yesterday. Not as easy as one might think.

PoJ can't 'withdraw' anything because no application exists; only a planning permission. The department could revoke that permission under Article 27 of the Planning and Building Law, but this comes with a compensation clause in favour of the applicant which (theoretically at least) puts the taxpayer at risk. I think we can overcome this with a Planning Obligation Agreement under Article 25 of the P&B Law, if all parties are prepared to agree. An agreement need not be tied to a planning permission, it just needs to say that if GoJ revoke planning permission for this development, then PoJ won't go for compensation.

Finally, there is the issue of the works already carried out to the building (legitimately, by commencing the planning permission) and what is to be done going forward. That may be a discussion for another day, but it would be good to know PoJ's intentions.

I hope this helps.
