N.B. Les Quennevais have provided information as requested. It does not put the information into any form of context as only core subjects are sat by the whole/vast majority of the cohort (approximately 110 students each year). All option subjects are sat by a wide ranging number of students which will result in wide ranging percentages. An example of this is in 2017 the number of students receiving extra time in Sports Studies was 50% which appears high; however, only 4 students sat this exam, so small numbers will always result in high percentages. It must be noted that the allocation of extra time is not a decision of the school but is governed by a set of external regulations to which a school must adhere. It must also be noted that these regulations are reviewed and modified by the external governing body on a yearly basis.
