It is not as if this statue is a historical relic - it was unveiled in 2014 and frankly the Constable should have known better. Was it a personal hero of his? Was it done to get more people into the pub, which had just been rebranded?

Do we not lay wreaths on 9th May to commemorate the forced Slave Workers who died under the evil Nazi regime? Maybe Hitler was just a man of his time?

Can you imagine if we had a left-wing Constable of St Brelade who decided to commission and/or unveil a statue of Karl Marx to go outside the recently renamed Trafalgar, which was now called the Marx and Engel's Pub?

As Minister for Culture, I would suggest putting it at the museum (maybe the Maritime Museum, given the naval and seafaring connections) as part of a wider, standing exhibition on the workings of the slave trade and the victims.

I know this will not go down well with the many hard right nationalists in our assembly, but we do not need statues to remember history. And if we must have a statue, why not have one to Louisa Gould, Claude Cahun, Victor Hugo, Claude Debussy (wherever in the island).

Whilst we are at it, maybe we could replace the King George II statue (temporarily or permanently) with a statue to Ivy Forster (the first female Jersey States Member) or even Caroline Trachy, who was prevented no from even standing in 1922 by a corrupt Constable of St Helier (I presume).

The George Carteret statue was very much a personal project that John led.

There is not a great deal of information held at the Parish Hall.

I looked at the contract for commissioning the statue and the Parish was not party to it, John signed the contract himself as representative of the George Carteret Project

I know that he was very clear at the time that no parish funds had been used.

A spreadsheet was kept but there is not a great details and for GDPR purposes I have removed the names of the individuals or Companies unless they were States of Jersey related.

This includes the following

Jersey Airport -	20000
Planning -	1114.50

Total	49037.54

The States in one way or another appear to have been the major contributor with 15000 from the Treasury and 20000 from the Airport an arm's length company.

Some items Planning/GST were probably refunds again from the States of Jersey.

I believe the funding for the Statue was part of a CSR project from the building contractors who build the sheltered accommodation in St Peter for senior citizens.

I have copied in Connétable Richard Vibert who may be able to confirm the exact position regarding the funding, although I am mindful this statue was placed during his predecessor's tenure (Connétable John Refault).

The Bailiff attended the unveiling in September 2014. I can't find any reference to the level of my predecessor's involvement but will look into this and report back.

Further to today's answer from the Treasury Minister, I am sharing this supplementary information.

I note from this pamphlet that was prepared for the unveiling of the statue in 2014, that there were a number of sponsors listed, including TTS and Youth Service.

I am seeking clarification on whether these two provided any cash contribution, or just a benefit in kind.

Can also confirm I have received a further breakdown of costs in the following terms:
