Subject: Access to publicly subsidised education

1. Overview

This policy outlines the access to education services (to a specified level of qualification).

2. Scope

This policy applies to children and young people accessing education at the following phases:

- Pre-school Education (3-4 years)
- Compulsory School Age (5-16 years)
- Post 16 Education (16-18 years)
- Further Education (19+ years)

3. Policy/Standards

Pre-school Education (3-4 years)¹

Access to publicly subsidised pre-school education is available to:

- British & EEA² children
- Third Country Nationals holding the appropriate visa ^{3 4 5 6}

¹ The period in which a child's fourth birthday falls between 1st September and ending on 31st August.

² EEA (European Economic Area which includes the European Union).

³ Non British, & non-EEA children holding the appropriate visa.

⁴ The entitlement to access education based on visa type is defined within the 'Directions of the Lieutenant-Governor'. All cases should be referred to the Customs & Immigration Service - immigration@gov.je

⁵ The type of educational establishment at which a non-British, & non-EEA child can study at is defined in the 'Directions of the Lieutenant-Governor' and is linked to visa type.

⁶ Third Country Nationals who enter Jersey on a General Visitor Visa, Child Visitor Visa, Student Visitor Visa or Student Visa will be liable to pay full fees and are unable to study at a wholly maintained school (non-fee paying States of Jersey School).

Compulsory School Age (5-16 years)⁷

Access to publicly subsidised compulsory education is available to:

- British & EEA children
- Third Country Nationals holding the appropriate visa ^{3 4 5 6}

Post 16 Education (16-18 years)89

Access to publicly subsidised post 16 education is available to:

- British & EEA students living with their parents or a family member who has parental responsibility for them
- British & EEA students moving from compulsory education within a Jersey school to post 16 education
- British & EEA students who have been ordinarily resident in Jersey for a minimum of one year¹⁰
- Third Country Nationals holding the appropriate visa ^{3 4 5 6}

Further Education (19+ years)¹¹

Access to publicly subsidised further education is available to:

- British and EEA students who are 'Entitled', 'Licensed' or 'Entitled to Work Only'
- British and EEA students who are 'Registered' and have been ordinarily resident in Jersey for a minimum of one year¹²
- Third Country Nationals holding the appropriate visa and have been ordinarily resident in Jersey for a minimum of one year ^{3 4 5 6 13}

⁷ As defined in the Education (Jersey) Law 1999, Article 2.

⁸ Post 16 Education is defined as the period in which a child of non-compulsory school age aged 18 or under as of 31^{st} August commences a course of study.

⁹ Access to publicly funded post-16 education is only available for recognised qualifications and delivered at ESC funded establishment.

¹⁰ Students must be ordinarily resident in Jersey for a minimum of one year before the course commences.

¹¹ Further Education (excluding Higher Education) is defined as the period in which an adult aged 19 or over as of 1st September commences a course of study. This does not include adult education courses.

¹² Students must be ordinarily resident in Jersey for a minimum of one year before the course commences.

¹³ Students must be ordinarily resident in Jersey for a minimum of one year before the course commences.
