Special interests of the site

Historic interest

A building is shown on this site on the Richmond Map of 1795 - west wing is C18 - while the main house is C19, built circa 1820s.

Architectural interest

Main farmhouse (2 storey, 5 bay) with 5 bay outbuildings to east and 5 bay cottage wing to west. Detached to east is 2 storey range with single storey sheds parallel to north, running east to tall open shed and 2 storey outbuilding. Farmhouse front (south) elevation: slate roof with two historic dormers with 2 pane (1/1) sashes with margin lights. Yellow brick chimneys to each gable. Walls rendered. Datestone 18 INC MLT 21. Windows 12 pane (6/6) sashes, no horns. Door 4 panel, 2 upper glazed, with overlight with stained glass. Cottage west wing (south) elevation: pantile roof with granite chimney, with dripstones, to west gable. 3 dormers. Wall random rubble granite, one window has brick opening. Windows and doors replacements. East wing (south) elevation: pantile roof with brick chimney. Walls rubble with dressed stone openings. Windows 12 pane (6/6) sashes with horns. Door 6 panel with side 3 panel and 6 pane overlight. Farmhouse rear (north) elevation: slate roof with raked dormer. Walls rubble with brick dressed openings. Windows 12 pane (6/6) sashes, no horns. Door 4 panel, upper two glazed. Lean-to to west has slate roof with brick chimney to gable. Rendered wall with replacement window and door. Cottage wing to west (north) elevation: rebuilt in C21: pantile roof with raked dormer and C21 rooflight. Datestone 17 INC IPL 70 relocated to window lintel. Replacement windows and door. Outbuildings to east (north) elevation: pantile roof with hay hatch of corrugated iron. Walls are rubble with dressed stone openings. C20 lean-to to west end. Windows are 4 and 6 pane over boarding. Detached range to east: slate roof. Walls rubble with dressed stone openings. Windows assorted, mainly 12 pane (6/6) sashes. Doors boarded with 6 pane overlights to those on ground floor. Stable has quoin inscribed '1833'.

Central entrance, double pile. Through hallway with stair in open well. Stair has mahogany turned balusters terminating in spiral. 6 panel doors throughout with original, reed moulded, architraves. Ground floor south west room has salvaged fireplace, north room in east wing has salvaged fire grate. First floor west room cupboard doors and architraves and window architraves all reed moulded.

This farm group sits impressively in the valley. It retains its character, proportions and many historic features both externally and internally. It remains a cohesive farm group with the farm buildings retaining much historic fabric.
