

PETROLEUM (LICENSING) (FEES) (JERSEY) ORDER 2012

Made

Coming into force

THE MINISTER FOR HOME AFFAIRS, in pursuance of Article 3(3) of the Petroleum (Jersey) Law 1984, orders as follows –

1 Fees for licence applications

(1) The fees prescribed for the purposes of Article 3(3) of the Petroleum (Jersey) Law 1984 shall be –

(a)	in the case of an application to keep petroleum- spirit at premises comprising a bulk fuel storage depot	£2,500
(b)	in the case of an application to keep petroleum- spirit at premises for the purposes of distribution to premises used for dispensing petroleum-spirit for retail or private supply or to a person for private use	£1,000
(c)	in the case of an application to keep petroleum- spirit at premises used for dispensing petroleum- spirit for retail or private supply, not being premises falling within the description in paragraph (b)	£200, plus £50 per petroleum dispenser used at the premises for such supply

- (2) The fee payable under paragraph (1) shall be in respect of a licence of 1 year's duration or less.
- (3) The fee payable in respect of a licence of more than 1 year's duration shall be the fee for 1 year, calculated in accordance with paragraph (1), multiplied by the number of years or parts of years for which the licence or renewal of a licence is granted.
- (4) In the event that an application for a licence or renewal of a licence not being granted the fee shall not be refunded.



(5) In this Article "bulk fuel storage depot" means a depot capable of storing 150,000 or more litres of petroleum-spirit.

2 Earlier Order revoked

The Petroleum (Licensing) (Fees) (Jersey) Order 2001 is revoked.

3 Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as the Petroleum (Licensing) (Fees) (Jersey) Order 2012 and shall come into force one week after it is made.
