Coming into force

THE MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND TECHNICAL SERVICES, in pursuance of Article 2 of the Entertainments on Public Roads (Jersey) Law 1985, and after consultation with the Connétables of St. Ouen, St. Peter and St. Brelade, orders as follows –

1 Interpretation

In this Order -

"entertainment" means the entertainment in the form of a cycle race comprising time trials in the parishes of St. Ouen, St. Peter and St. Brelade that is part of an event known as the 2015 Island Games;

"entertainment area" means a specified part of a public road named in column 1 of the Schedule being the part that runs from a public road specified opposite in column 2 of the Schedule to public road specified opposite in column 3 of the Schedule;

"promoter" means the promoter referred to in Article 2;

"specified period" means the period 8.45 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. on Sunday 28th June 2015.

2 Promoter

For the purposes of this Order, Jersey Cycling, incorporated under Article 4 of the Loi (1862) sur les teneures en fidéicommis et l'incorporation d'associations, is the promoter.

3 Use of roads for entertainment

If the requirements as to insurance and public notice set out in Articles 7 and 8 are complied with, the entertainment area may be used during the specified period for any of the following purposes –

- (a) the holding of the entertainment;
- (b) the viewing of the entertainment;
- (c) the making of arrangements preparatory to the holding and viewing of the entertainment.

4 Prohibition, restriction and regulation of traffic on roads so used

- (1) The promoter may, during the specified period for any of the purposes referred to in Article 3 cause the westbound carriageway of La Route Orange between its junction with La Route des Quennevais and its junction with La Rue de Sergente to be closed to vehicular traffic.
- (2) A person appointed by the promoter as an event marshal for the purposes of this Order or a police officer may, during the specified period for any of the purposes referred to in Article 3, prohibit, restrict, regulate or allow the access of persons (whether with motor vehicles or otherwise) to any part of the entertainment area if he or she considers it necessary to do so in the interests of safety or convenience of the public.
- (3) Members of the fire and rescue service, ambulance service, coast guard or Royal National Lifeboat Institute, or police officers, may (whether with motor vehicles or otherwise) enter and use any part of the entertainment area during the specified period, to the extent that it is reasonably necessary for them to do so in order to perform their duties.

5 Material required for entertainment

- (1) Between 6.00 p.m. on Saturday 27th June 2015 and 2.00 p.m. on Sunday 28th June 2015, the promoter may cause to be placed and maintained on
 - (a) the footpaths and sides of the carriageways forming any part of the entertainment area; or
 - (b) the median lines of any part of the entertainment area,
 - material required for the purposes of or in connection with the entertainment.
- (2) However, material shall not be placed in pursuance of this Article unless adequately illuminated from half an hour after sunset to half an hour before sunrise so as to give reasonable warning to pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

6 Other arrangements for safety of public, or purposes incidental to the entertainment

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the –

- (a) Road Traffic (St. Ouen) (Jersey) Order 1979;
- (b) Road Traffic (St. Peter) (Jersey) Order 1992; or
- (c) Road Traffic (St. Brelade) (Jersey) Order 1990,



a motor vehicle shall not remain on any part of the entertainment area during the specified period except with the permission of the promoter, a police officer, or a person appointed by the promoter as an event marshal.

7 Insurance cover

The requirements of this Article to which Article 3 refers are that the promoter must produce to the Minister evidence that there is insurance (to the satisfaction of the Minister) by Monday 15th June 2015 against any liability that may be incurred by –

- (a) any person organizing, supervising, or concerned in the conduct of, the entertainment;
- (b) the promoter;
- (c) any official, agent or servant of the promoter;
- (d) any person taking part in the entertainment,

in respect of damage to property, or in respect of the death of any person or bodily injury to any person, resulting from the holding or viewing of the entertainment or from any of the preparations for the entertainment.

8 Public notice of restrictions

- (1) The requirements of this Article to which Article 3 refers are as set out in paragraphs (2) and (3).
- (2) On 2 occasions during the 9 days immediately preceding Saturday 27th June 2015, the promoter shall cause to be published in the Jersey Gazette notice of the arrangements that will apply under Articles 4(1), 4(2) and 6, specifying the parts of the public roads affected and the period during which they will be affected.
- (3) Each notice shall be certified by the Greffier of the States as a notice that is being published in pursuance of this Order.

9 Citation

This Order may be cited as the Island Games (Cycle Race – Time Trials – St. Ouen, St. Peter and St. Brelade) (Jersey) Order 2015.
